I surely enjoy your coverage although I don't have the time to watch all I'd like to.

Many years ago I hear Tom Wicker in a talk before the Boston Forum about the news media say that the danger was far more what is not reported than what is incorrectly reported. You have helped to fill that void. But the task is not easy.

The CISPIS organization which supports the FMLN in El Salvador could certainly be regarded as an irresponsible organization since it brought a costly and what was later determined by a judge to be a frivolous case against Secord and others involved in the Iran-Contra affair.
