Your attendance would ensure a successful Fair. (We surmise your appearance would out-draw our last special guest - a Mutant Teenage Ninja Turtle!)

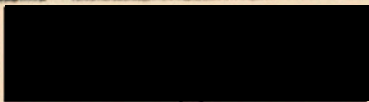
If you cannot attend, may we secure permission to use your name and have a "Rush Limbaugh Look-Alike Contest"?
