VOTED FOR KENNEDY, GOLDWATER, NIXON, NIXON, CARTER, CARTER, NO VOTE, BARBARA BUSH.

I CALLED PEROT HEADQUARTERS IN DALLAS, TEXAS IN MARCH OF 1992. MY NAME AND PHONE NUMBER WAS TAKEN. APRIL 6 I WAS CONTACTED BY SOMEONE REPRESENTING THE PEROT PETITION COMMITTEE AND ASK TO COME TO BUCKHEAD (DOWNTOWN ATLANTA) FOR AN ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING ON APRIL 7. BUCKHEAD CALLED BACK THREE HOURS BEFORE THE MEETING WAS TO TAKE PLACE AND TOLD ME NOT TO COME BUT TO STAND BY. BUCKHEAD CALLED BACK ON APRIL 21 (THIS GAVE THEM TWO WEEKS TO STACK THE DECK) AND TOLD ME [REDACTED] COUNTY COORDINATORS RECEIVED THE PETITIONS AT A MEETING IN BUCKHEAD ON APRIL 22. BY THE WORST SCENARIO, GEORGIA HAD ENOUGH GOOD SIGNATURES (27,000+) BY MAY 2 TO PUT MR. PEROT ON THE BALLOT IN GEORGIA. THIRTY OF US VOLUNTEERS COLLECTED 2,700+ SIGNATURES IN CLAYTON COUNTY.

HINDSIGHT TELLS ME THE PEROT PETITION COMMITTEE OF GA. (BUCKHEAD BOYS) DIDN'T NEED US VOLUNTEERS ANYMORE AFTER MAY 2 BUT WE DIDN'T REALIZE THAT AND CONTINUED TO COLLECT (137,000+) SIGNATURES AND DELIVER THEM TO BUCKHEAD ALONG WITH THE PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE OF BUTTONS AND BUMPER STICKERS. THE ORIGINAL 20 DALLAS BASED PEROT GROUP EMPLOYEES WHO WERE SENT OUT AROUND THE COUNTRY TO MONITOR THE PETITION DRIVE, BECAME INTOXICATED WITH POWER. DID MR. PEROT KNOW THIS? I DON'T KNOW BUT HOPEFULLY HE DIDN'T. THE GRASS ROOTS MOVEMENT WAS DEAD.

MY MOTHER TAUGHT ME TO LOOK FOR THE GOOD AND I FOUND THAT IN ALL THOSE BEAUTIFUL PEOPLE WHO SIGNED THE PETITION.
