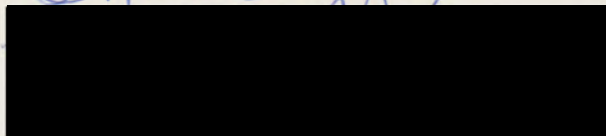

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The mallard is undoubtedly the best-known duck in the world. Many centuries ago it was domesticated in Europe and, to this day, mallards will still interbreed with white "puddle-ducks" — creating strange color combinations. Mallards can be found in marshes, ponds, rivers, lakes and bays. Gathering by the hundreds, mallards will dabble in the water for their favorite foods — living plant and animal matter. At the end of winter, females and males pair off and build nests of grass or reed on shores or islets. A female lays twelve eggs which she will brood for 24 to 28 days before the ducklings hatch. Fiercely protective, the female mallard stays with her brood about two months during breeding season, adult
