Dear Mr. Lamb:

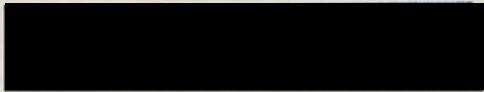
On Saturday, April 24, 1993, you interviewed the president of Blue Shield/Blue Cross; a caller commented about his annual salary; you failed to follow through on this point and did not ask if administrative salary were a contributing factor to increased hospital costs. Perhaps in the future, you will pursue this point.

On Wednesday, April 21, 1995, Lynn Jimenez, the business reporter for KGO radio in San Francisco, reported that the average CEO of a Fortune 500 corporation receives 3.8 million dollars per year; however, the presidents and CEO's of some of these hospital plans, pharmaceutical companies, and hospital supply companies receive anywhere from 50 to 137 million dollars per year.

That five dollar aspirin you paid for while in your five hundred dollar a day hospital room goes to pay these obscene salaries.

I hope in the future you will bring out this point and follow through with your caller's comments.
