

Fairness doctrine

C-SPAN, overwhelmed by callers hostile to President Clinton, is changing the way it decides who gets on the air.

"We always had separate telephone lines, divided by region — Eastern, Central and Western," network spokeswoman Lea Anne Long told the Associated Press yesterday. "We experimented separating the lines by Democrats, Republicans or other."

The anti-Clinton callers were jamming the phone lines by a ratio of 5-1, so C-SPAN chairman and on-air personality Brian Lamb ordered the realignment, the wire service said.

Now, on-air calls will cycle among pro-Clinton, anti-Clinton and other.

"All we are trying to achieve is balance and getting as many different points of view as we can. The reasoning is to try to get more different voices," Miss Long said.

We did wonder just how long it would be before that leftist Lamb would finally dictate censorship...

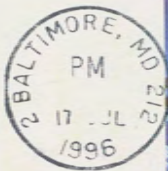
He loves to court the gay things and one can easily detect the bias in his eyes, his voice and the questions he asks of those that tow his line...the leftwing democrat spin.
