"Some people have prejudice toward the Mormons, but I can remember when we treated Catholics and Pentecostals the same way," Burrow said.

Burrow, whose church is adjacent to the Mormon ward chapel, said members of the Mormon Church's San Pedro Ward are good neighbors whose faith is centered in Jesus Christ.

Theological differences haven't kept the two congregations from becoming fast friends and helping each other celebrate milestones in their community life.

He hopes the same will be true with other churches in the neighborhood.

"We have to be concerned about presenting a united front in fighting evil in our society, not quibbling over differences among ourselves," Burrow said.

Dick Lacy, bishop of the San Pedro Ward of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, agreed and said he's excited about being a

part of the lunch series.

"We're responsible for the program March 16, and it's not going to be anything radical or different from what people would hear from their own ministers," Lacy said.

Mormons don't usually observe Lent, he said, but neither do some other Protestant denominations.

"We certainly teach a strong faith in Jesus Christ, we celebrate Easter and we teach about the events leading up to and including the death of Jesus on the cross," he said.

"If our participation in these lunches helps clear up some misunderstanding about our teachings, we're happy about that, but the main point in our participating is to be a part of a community promoting Christianity," Lacy said.

"We're not a sect or a cult as some people characterize us."

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tory Month is supposed to eliminate: The myth that black Americans as historical victims of racism and have never contributed anything to the building of America. The spirit of self-reliance, indeed an integral part of black American heritage, is curiously given little time and space.

"The truth is that values like self-help, strong families, religion, patriotism and non-reliance on government, only recently linked to conservatism, are rooted in black history. It was these values that helped blacks survive, and in some cases, prosper through the worst of oppression.

"The black history most of us learned while growing up in the 1950s and '60s conveyed that message. The two people most often mentioned then, Booker T. Washington and George Washington Carver, epitomized the concept of self-help and overcoming severe obstacles to make it in America.

"By the '60s, a move to draw attention away from these two heroes nearly succeeded. They're the only ones we ever hear about' was the complaint then, and they are seldom, if ever, mentioned today during Black History Month. Considered the decade of great progress for black America, the '60s was also the beginning of black historical revisionism that continues to this day."

"By far the biggest victim of black history rewrites has been Booker T. Washington and the philosophy for which he stood. Suddenly Washington has gone from the greatest black American ever to historical whipping boy."

"While groups like the NAACP had always been Washington's nemesis, the black militants of the 1960s formed an unlikely alliance in maligning him."

"Washington set out to let

used the name of civil rights to hide their communist agenda, fed to them directly from Moscow. Believing that their 40-year-old indoctrination of blacks was nearly successful, the group's leaders were overly trustful of black women. Julia was trusted with the group's real intent to change America into a socialist state, blacks as 'social leverage tools.' Becoming increasingly terrified at what she was learning in her Wednesday night meetings, she consulted her husband and a friend who encouraged her to go the FBI.

"Having informed the FBI that communist forces had penetrated the civil rights movement for the purposes of overthrowing the United States, using social unrest while quietly penetrating government and educational institutions, she was further shocked to learn they were already aware of the closely held scheme. She was asked by the Cleveland FBI office to maintain her contacts for the purpose of becoming an informant.

"Reluctantly she did and she was drawn deeper and deeper

Luther King, Jr. and other leaders.

"In disbelief about what she had discovered she was confounded that the perpetrators of the scheme were not tried and imprisoned for high treason. She further endangered herself with a national speaking tour she called, I HAVE A DREAM, TOO, calling attention to the facts she had reported and the resultant fraud against black people."

"While we have saved him for last, no person in modern black history has embodied the principles, ideas and the forgotten wisdom of conservatism more than George Schuyler. Born in Syracuse, New York in 1895, he worked a variety of jobs and considered 'work' the truest form of education. He served in the Army as a 1st Lt. in World War I. He drew from his work and military experiences to create the mood for various vignettes he wrote for many publications including **The Nation**, **Opportunity**, and **Crisis**. Most of his work appeared in the **Pittsburgh Courier**. It was the latter that allowed him to reach the black masses with ideas considered today to be too conservative for mixed company. Despite the black establishment's rejection of him, he was 'a near Moses figure' to blacks the world over.

"Schuyler frequently attacked civil rights groups whom he called 'pundits of the Negro problem.' He disliked W.E.B. DuBois' 'talented tenth' theory preferring to deal with what he called 'the untalented nine-tenths.'

"His outlook on black Americans could be best described in the opening of his 1966 autobiography **Black and Conservative**. He said, 'I learned very early in life that I was colored but from the beginning this fact of life did not distress, restrain, or overburden me. One learns to take things as they are, lives with it, or tries to turn them to his advantage or seeks another locale where opportunities are more favorable. This was the viewpoint of my parents and

Said to be born with a pen in his hand, George Schuyler died in 1977, one of America's most accomplished journalists. Some see him as the father of today's black conservative movement. Hated by establishment blacks, His book, *Black and Conservative* is still widely read.

"In the very first year he began pounding the keyboard of his old Smith-Corona typewriter, he became internationally recognized. In writing an article he called 'The Reds and I,' he articulated the question on everyone's mind, then and now. 'I have been asked by the sincerely curious how an American who is colored can be simultaneously a conservative and unalterably opposed to the communist rumble-bumble.' His answer left people unsure of which feeling to give into first, uproarious laughter or deep contemplation. He responds, 'Of course, being colored is only incidental—like being right-handed, green eyed or sleeping on one's left side. The most important of my attributes is being an American . . . born, bred, and nurtured on the native soil, and having affection for and allegiance to its basic customs and beliefs.' This kind of talk would never get him today's Essence Award. It did get him the respect and admiration of untold millions in nearly every corner of the world, except within the American black leadership.
