The program —

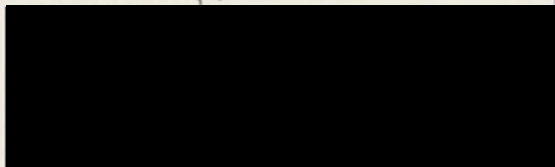
So far — of those I've
