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COMING UP ON "BOOKNOTES:"

Washington, D.C., October 28, 1993 -- Every Sunday at 8:00 and 11:00pm (ET), C-SPAN brings cable viewers nationwide a one-hour interview with the author of a recent book on public affairs. In addition to the substance of the writings, "Booknotes" looks at the life and interests of the author.

Sunday, October 31 -- Andrew Nagorski discusses *The Birth of Freedom: Shaping Lives & Societies in the New Eastern Europe*, a look into the issues facing Eastern European nations, as they transform from communism into democracy. Mr. Nagorski is a Warsaw bureau chief for Newsweek magazine.

Sunday, November 7 -- C-SPAN interviews Charles Mee, author of *Playing God: Seven Fateful Moments When Great Men Met to Change the World*. Mr. Mee is a former editor of American Heritage magazine and author of *Genius of the People*.

Sunday, November 14 -- Herbert Block speaks about *Herblock: A Cartoonist's Life*, a narrative of wars and scandals that spanned since the Roosevelt era. Herbert Block is the only living cartoonist whose work is in the National Gallery of Art, and the only cartoonist to win the Elijah Parish Lovejoy Award.

Sunday, November 21 -- Richard Reeves, author of *President Kennedy: Profile of Power*, gives an account of John F. Kennedy's presidency, based on previously unavailable White House files, letters, and interviews. Mr. Reeves is a teacher of political science at UCLA and the author of eight books.

Sunday, November 28 -- Betty Friedan discusses *The Fountain of Age*, a personal book, which looks at aging as a stage in personal growth. Betty Friedan is the author of *The Feminine Mystique* and founder of the National Organization for Women and the National Women's Political Caucus.
