Two birds setting on a fence, one said, "I love you." The other answers, "PROVE IT?"

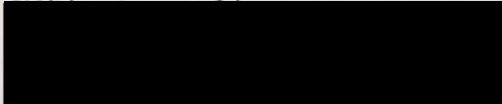
Even a closet racist could not exist for long, for daily one would have to prove one's self by what one does.
