C-SPAN TO TELEVISION KENNEDY SCHOOL OF GOVERNMENT SYMPOSIUMS  
November 24th - 28th

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- During Thanksgiving week -- November 24 - 28 -- C-SPAN cable network is planning to televise, in their entirety, five symposiums sponsored by Harvard's John F. Kennedy School of Government during its recent anniversary. The 90-minute programs -- aired daily from 12:00 - 1:30 pm ET -- feature national figures tackling prevalent public policy issues including Sen. Daniel P. Moynihan (D-NY) on America's Poor; U.S. Surgeon General, Dr. C. Everett Koop, on Expected Changes in Health Policy; and McGeorge Bundy, National Security Advisor to Presidents Kennedy and Johnson, on Presidential Leadership.

## THANKSGIVING WEEK ON C-SPAN:

### Kennedy School Forums and the "Great Americans" Series

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Thanksgiving week on C-SPAN offers a number of special programs to cable viewers interested in the "who's" as well as the "whys" of public policy issues.

Monday through Friday - November 24-28 - at Noon ET, C-SPAN will televise public policy forums sponsored by the J.F. Kennedy School of Government in conjunction with Harvard University's 350th anniversary. The daily topics are as diverse as smoking and health policy to foreign views of American politics. National figures are featured each day including New York Sen. Daniel Patrick Moynihan, Surgeon General C. Everett Koop and former National Security Advisor McGeorge Bundy.

On Thanksgiving Day, C-SPAN's viewer call-in programs will be replaced with the latest installments of the cable network's "Great Americans" series. Each holiday, C-SPAN offers hour-long personal profiles of people who are deeply involved in the country's public policy process.

Featured on Thanksgiving Day are Pamela Harriman, widow of Averell Harriman and current chairman of the political action committee "Democrats for the '80's" and Joseph Coors, vice chairman of the Adolph Coors Company and founder of the Heritage Foundation, a conservative Washington think tank. Although ideologically different, both are long-time political activists who offer their time and funds to national issues and party politics.
