Can "We Americans" Pay Off the Debt?

Each American's debt produced by and for us Americans according to our Government, that is the President, Congress, and Senate, is said to be some \$17,000.00! Our Government says that "We Americans" have to stop this spending! It follows that responsible people should ask, "How do 'We Americans' stop this spending?"

It is apparent that our government cannot control "We Americans." So, that leaves "We Americans" to do it for "them." The only way to stop anyone from spending is to "cancel" his/her credit cards and source of money. But you first have to define the "credit card" and the "money" in the Government context.

The credit card is the projected (not real) Estimated Tax Revenue for the following year. The money is the collected (real) Tax Revenue. The difference becomes the debt (borrowing from the future) and the interest owed is called the deficit.

The debt and deficit are no different than the principal (debt) and interest (deficit) on a mortgage for your home. Anyone who is a homeowner knows that if they pay extra money into the principal (debt), the interest (deficit) will go down, and the house is worth more money (dollars). We have to remove the Government's access to the money (actual tax revenue), this will mean that the Government's ability for a larger Projected Estimated Tax Revenue (credit card) is decreased.

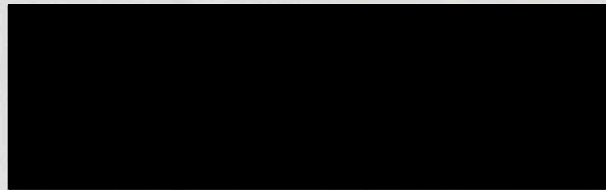
How do "We Americans" do this?

The following might be the best secret (intentional or otherwise) kept from "We Americans." There exists in the U.S. Department of the Treasury a "Bureau of the Public Debt," Washington, D.C. 20239-0001. Donations money (projected tax owed) made to this account (gifts to reduce the public debt) go directly to the Public Debt Fund and is tax deductible according to Public Law 87-58. Such donations in effect remove "real" money (tax revenue) from the government's spending system and limit what the government can use as a figure for the Projected Estimated Tax Revenue (credit card).

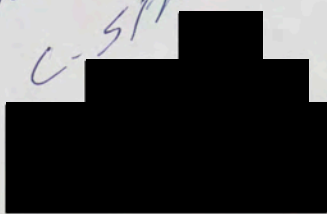
Donations to this account can be made throughout the year and are deductible from gross income on that year's income tax (save receipts). In some cases, this would lower your tax bracket. Checks or money orders should be made out to Department of the Treasury, and stated as "Gifts to Reduce the Public Debt."

The above account should not be confused with the Administration and Congress proposed Deficit Reduction Trust Fund, which will be used to write loans through and give the illusion that the deficit is lower than it really is. In reality, it is increasing the overall debt!
