Richard Armour leads a double life, and the two are brought together in *Our Presidents*. One life is that of a Harvard Ph.D. who has written scholarly books, has taught at a number of universities, and has lectured for the State Department in Europe and Asia. His other life involves writing thousands of pieces of light verse and prose humor and satire for numerous magazines in the United States and England and such parodies and spoofs of history and literature as *It All Started with Columbus*, *It All Started with Eve*, *The Classics Reclassified*, *Twisted Tales from Shakespeare*, *English Lit Relit*, and *American Lit Relit*, to mention a few of his more than 60 books.

Leonard Everett Fisher is himself a scholar and teacher, with a Master of Fine Arts from Yale and a Pulitzer Art Award. He is Academic Dean Emeritus of the Paier College of Art in Connecticut. He has also served in numerous public service and governmental roles including that of Designer/Consultant to the United States Postal Service. He has illustrated more than one hundred sixty books, forty of which he also authored. His work has appeared in numerous exhibitions and one-man shows at leading galleries and institutions in the United States and abroad. He has won numerous prizes and awards.
