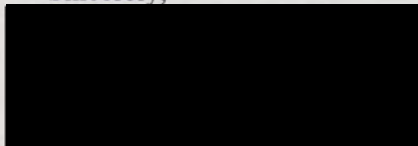
Dear Mr. Lamb:
