### RELIGION AND PUBLIC POLICY CONFERENCE ON C-SPAN

Washington, D.C.--C-SPAN will air a panel discussion sponsored by Georgetown University (G.U.) entitled "The Role of Religion in the Formation of Public Officials: Practitioners" on Sunday, April 16, at 6pm ET. *A Bicentennial Conference*

This two-day conference will analyze the role of religion in public policy decision-making in a democracy in the context of 200 years of American history and educational development.

This conference is part of Georgetown University's year-long Bicentennial project on the three branches of the federal government entitled "Constitutional Government in a Changing American Society."

In the absence of an officially endorsed religion in a pluralistic, democratic society, religious convictions assume more, not less, importance. Responsibility to the public assumes a code of conduct reflecting religious convictions and values antecedent to and independent of that society. Where do these come from? How pervasive are they? Can we do without them? What motivates public officials in their decisions? Has religion done so and is it a formative influence on public officials? Should it be in the future? Educational specialists, media experts, elected and appointed public officials, and religious leaders will address these questions during the conference.

*What was the influence of religion on the creation of the new government in 1789 and the continuing influence of religion in creating, framing, and influencing public policy issues?*

*Besides religious institutions, public officials are affected by a variety of direct and indirect influences, including formal and informal education, family, ethnic heritage, and the media. Is religion the single most important influence in determining the values and ethical conduct of public officials? Should it be?*
