why not repeat that program, and add the questions and answers?

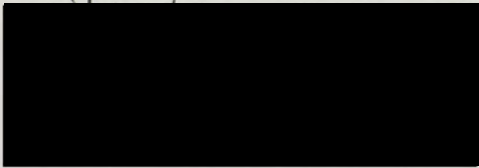
Another beef: while English translations are used such as when you are covering the United Nations, the volume of the speaker can be too high.
