

Why I Watch C-Span

In the complicated world of today, a tremendous amount of newsworthy information is available to the public. Under normal circumstances this information is condensed by the standard news media such as, T.V., radio and to some extent, the written media. This condensing is done to meet the special requirements of the individual type of media. The danger of doing this is that a distorted view of the news may be intentionally or unintentionally presented to the public. C-Span avoids this distortion by giving the viewer a complete picture of the congressional events as they occur, on the floor of the House. The public doesn't have to depend on information presented second hand by the general media. There is no time delay and

the useful information received from the House can be immediately used for the purpose of individual analysis of the events of the day. This information is extremely important because topics being debated today on the House floor, have a direct effect on every person in the United States.

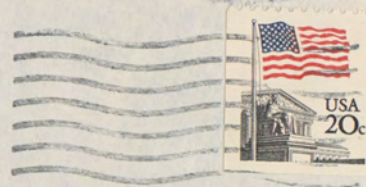
C-Span also presents in depth interviews with the decision makers and gives the public free access to these persons through telephone questions.
