**C-SPAN VIEWERS GET NIGHTLY WINDOW
ON CHANGES IN RUSSIA**

Washington, D.C., March 23, 1993 -- American viewers can get a first-hand perspective on rapidly changing events in Russia by watching C-SPAN. "Evening News From Moscow," the half-hour nightly newscast from Russia, **airs on C-SPAN, Monday - Friday, 6:00 PM (ET); Tuesday - Saturday, 7:25 AM (ET) and on C-SPAN2 Monday - Friday, at 8:00 PM (ET).**

"Evening News From Moscow" formerly known as "News 1" and "Vremya" ("Time"), underwent a major staff upheaval following the August 1991 coup events in the Soviet Union. C-SPAN has been offering this window on the changes in Russian life and Russian news reporting ever since.

An English translator provides a simultaneous voiced interpretation of the dialogue, which includes sports and weather.

C-SPAN is currently available in 58.7 million households and C-SPAN2 in 29.6 million households nationwide and worldwide via satellite. C-SPAN and C-SPAN2 are funded entirely by America's cable television companies as a public service.

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
