

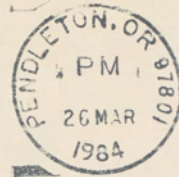
An informed citizenry is the base upon which a country rests. C-Span, through informing, educating, and involving US in the vital processes of government, provides that solid base.
