

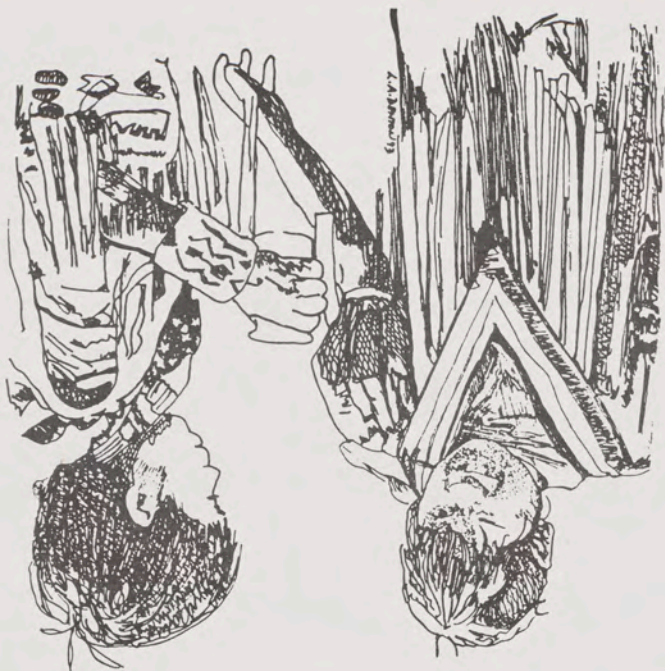
Re: Ron Allen, National

First and foremost, the Shrine is a place of prayer, healing and peace dedicated to Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha, often called the "Lily of the Mohawks".
