I found the congressional debate in January on whether or not to declare war to be interesting viewing. Many commentators have pointed to the importance of the debate as well as to the eloquence and frank nature of the comments. The speeches contain the full range of issues that Senators and Representatives think are important, both in going to war, and in keeping the peace. I can think of no better list of the issues that will be before the United States in the decades ahead.

It strikes me that the full record of those debates should be made available on video. Many individuals would be interested in having that taped record. In addition, their use in the classroom at the high school and college level could well be substantial, both as a fine example of our system of government at work and for the content of the comments made.

I urge C-SPAN to find a way to make this record available.
