#### C-SPAN TO COVER VERMONT POLITICAL SCENE

On-location Programming Examines US Senate, Governor's Race

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- C-SPAN's "Campaign '86" previews Vermont's U.S. Senate and gubernatorial races September 5,6 and 8th from the vantage point of the State House in Montpelier.

Friday, September 5 is devoted to the U.S. Senate race. Coverage begins at 5:30 pm ET with a taped news conference held by Republican frontrunner, former Governor Richard Snelling, immediately followed at 6:00 pm by a live viewer call-in with the candidate. At 9:30 pm ET, Democratic incumbent Sen. Patrick Leahy answers viewer questions about his re-election campaign on a live viewer call-in. C-SPAN airs a 20-minute interview with Republican Senate contender Anthony Doria of South Royalton Vermont, that same evening.

On Monday, September 8, beginning at 9:00 pm ET, Vermont gubernatorial contenders, incumbent Gov. Madeleine Kunin (D), Lt. Gov. Peter Smith (R), and Burlington Mayor Bernard Sanders (Ind.), participate in a 90-minute live candidates forum. The candidates will field questions from cable viewers throughout Vermont and across the country with a special phone line reserved for Vermont callers. C-SPAN's "Viewer Call-In" phone numbers for all Montpelier programs are: (202)628-2525 exclusively for Vermont callers and (202)783-2727 for all other states.

Political journalists from the Vermont Press Bureau, <u>Burlington Free Press</u>, Vermont News Service, and the Barre/Montpelier <u>Times Argus</u> discuss state politics and the '86 elections during a live 90-minute roundtable program on Saturday, September 6, at 5:30 pm ET.

C-SPAN's Vermont election programming also features "video verite" coverage of candidate appearances at the Vermont State Fair in Rutland, 50th Anniversary celebration of the Vermont Symphony Orchestra, and fundraisers across the state. These candidate vignettes will air in the transitions between Vermont programs to give viewers a sense of the campaign styles of the candidates.
