Dear Mr. Lamb;

Sunday, Feb. 18, Sometime in the afternoon here in Mesa, there was a program on C-Span, by Blacks and Black supporters. I don't know the title but a Professor from Morgan State, named Jesse M McDade, was on the panel.

I pay for Cable TV, primarily because of C-Span. This I do because of the objectivity you show in presenting both sides of an issue or problem. But I was disappointed in that the program listed above. It struck me as beyond the bounds of decency and propriety, and certainly not up to the standards of your usual presentations. Professor McDADE, demonstrated why racism is so prevalent in America. During the time that I watched, (My stomach couldn't endure all of it) Mr. McDade's statements were made to inflame racism. By contrast, what would have happened if a "Right-Winged, Group", had made such denigrating remarks, about such honorable Black leaders as the new Governor of Virginia on C-Span?

Isn't there any limit to what you will allow Blacks to say on C-Span? I know that you would never permit this to happen on C-Span, by the "Skin Heads"---an evil group of Whites, for the purpose of inflaming the emotions of people, especially Blacks.

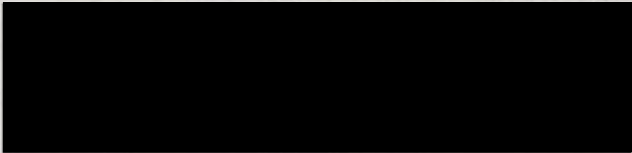
By contrast; Monday Feb. 19, 1990, during the morning hours, there was another program officiated by a Black Professor from Harvard. The program was about the "Charles Stuart--Willie Bennett fiasco", in Boston. In my opinion, this was very legitimate program about Black problems and the Media. It was objectively done with both black and white representatives from the Media in Boston. There is no doubt, that Blacks have problems, we whites don't relate to or understand, and our attitude toward them exacerbates the problems. But I also know that any solution to Black problems, must include massive support by the White population in America. That will **never** happen if Black Leaders are going to pontificate vitriolic diatribes, against Whites, every time they find themselves on radio or television. I wonder, how Mr. McDade, got to be a professor, in this country, since it is impossible for Blacks to get ahead, or progress upward in this evil Country?

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By the way, thanks for letting us watch and listen to Gen. Colin Powell, at Georetown University. He is a great American, A man I could surely vote for as President of this country, if given the opportunity. Do you know what Mr. McDade said about him? It was that his first name, should be spelled "Colon". An obviously crude way at saying "s--t" (or human excrement). Nuff said.

By the way, since I am writing to you, possibly I should mention a couple of things. A while back I subscribed to your "UP-DATE" paper, only to find that it almost never arrived at my home in time to fulfill it's purpose.
