Claim slaughter

NAIROBI, Kenya — A major human rights group says Somalia's government has in the past 19

months killed 50,000 to 60,000 civilians — many shot in their homes — whom it suspected of supporting or sympathizing with insurgents.

Somalia also has driven about a half-million others into exile, said Africa Watch, a New York-based group.

The group said Wednesday that most of the victims were members of the Isaak clan. The army suspects the clan of supporting or sympathizing with the Somali National Movement, a northern insurgent organization.

The movement, which draws its membership mostly from the Isaak clan, is the largest in northern Somalia. It was formed in 1981 but did not begin waging all-out war against the government until May 1988, when it attacked two main cities, Burao and Hargeisa.

There was no immediate reaction to the allegations from the socialist government of President Mohamed Siad Barre. Alleged rights abuses have prompted Western donors to severely cut aid to the Horn of Africa nation.

Following the rebel attacks on the two provincial capitals, Africa Watch said, "the army turned its firepower, including its air force and artillery, against the civilian population, causing predictably high casualties."
