Dear Mr. Lamb,

As I switched between football games today, I saw two programs which I believe you had pre-recorded in which you spent a great deal of time on a book review of a Henry Kissinger biography, and then later in the evening with a group of globalists headed by Jeanne Kirkpatrick.

I realize the theme of the day seemed to be internationalism, but I wondered whether it might not be possible for those of us who are avowed American nationalists to get some equal treatment. Lately anyone who speaks out against the "New World Order" and the subsequent abolishment of American sovereignty seems to be quickly labeled as "paranoid", "isolationist", "fascist", "racist", (and other such demeaning commentary) by our controlled press. I find it extremely unfair that anyone who prefers our own national and Constitutional institutions to the United Nations and these internationalist "thinktanks" must always struggle to get our views heard in a print media that is unabashedly internationalist. Your forums have always been what I consider the "fairest" electronic medium left in this country.

There are many American patriots (left and right) who can give you a far more balanced appraisal of the common threads you were seeking for those who hold membership in the C.F.R., and other such conspiratorial groups. 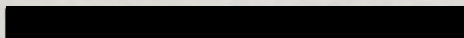
