-- C-SPAN EXAMINES LOUISIANA SENATE RACE --

-- "Campaign '86" Features Breaux & Moore In Live TV Forums --

WASHINGTON, D.C.-- C-SPAN's "Campaign '86" heads to Baton Rouge this August for a preview of the Louisiana U.S. Senate race and a taste of politics — Cajun-style.

C-SPAN has targeted the Louisiana U.S. Senate election -- a key race in the battle for party control of the Senate -- for five hours of special coverage. C-SPAN plans to televise two live candidate forums with two U.S. House members who have emerged as front-runners, from a field of fourteen, in Louisiana's U.S. Senate race: Republican Rep. Henson Moore and Democratic Rep. John Breaux.

The two 90-minute programs originate live from Baton Rouge, beginning at 9:00 pm Eastern/8:00 pm Central Time. Democratic contender John Breaux appears Monday, August 4 and GOP candidate Henson Moore appears Friday, August 8.

According to the program format, the candidates are interviewed by three Louisiana political journalists for the first 30 minutes. The public then has the opportunity to question the candidates during an hour-long C-SPAN "Viewer Call-In" show that follows immediately.

During the call-in portion of the program, candidates field questions from cable television viewers throughout Louisiana and across the country. A special phone line will be reserved for Louisiana callers only; C-SPAN will alternate between in-coming calls from Louisiana and all other states. C-SPAN's "Viewer Call-In" phone numbers are: (202) 628-2525 in Louisiana and (202) 783-2727 in All Other States.

C-SPAN's two-day telecasts also include taped coverage of a Democratic fundraiser, featuring Louisiana Senators Russell Long and J. Bennett Johnston and Representatives Breaux, Lindy Boggs, and Billy Tauzin; an "Olde Tyme" political rally with U.S. Congressmen Moore and Bob Livingston; and an interview with Hastings Wyman, publisher of the Southern Political Report.
