a number of programs on the subject.
Specific about fair & equal
coverage.

I believe I call-in this 8:00AM
with Brian Lamb mentioned the
affairs of Gov. Clinton & then Pres
Bush - & being fair. I think the
press & C-SPAN has responsibility to
bring out facts & inform on each
candidate individually, while giving
each call-in or guest each full
opinion.

I listened to a panel (C-SPAN,
Harvard School) included Larry King,
Carole Simpson, Family Fair editor
& I fax tabloid editor who was for
Gov. Clinton but had evidence & so ran
the story. The only evidence he

mentioned was that Gov. Clinton
apologized to Gov. ~~Thomas~~^{Cuomo} for his
remarks on the tape. I do not
know what other evidence he had.

I understand there is only
rumor, not a shred of evidence that
Pres. Bush had an affair. I
thought it was grossly unfair that
Mary McCormack (CNN) brought it up to
Pres. Bush in the presence of a
foreign dignitary.

To paint with the same brush
that both had an affair is grossly
unfair. Bush backing with nothing
whichever to go on. More than bias.

And I do believe it is the
responsibility of those conducting
interviews or programs to be fair
& stay on the facts.

I watch C-SPAN a great deal -
& it is a shame that in a 30+ speech
by candidates only a 30-60 sec.
soundbite makes it only on the 4 major
networks. And I believe character
is the most important issue of all.
