

A NEW AMERICAN FLAG

The American Republic has been changing since its foundation so that the traditional flag no longer represents our population as a banner of a republic should. The flag should reflect the ethnic backgrounds and sexual preference(s) of the people. Based on this fact the flag should be redesigned.

One suggested design is:

The field of the entire flag will be pale blue, the stripes shall be pink and on the blue-field flowers will substitute for the stars. These are to be pastel colors for the most part. Pansies, snapdragons, violets, daisies, orchids, and forget-me-nots for example. The only bright colors permitted are some scattered yellow jonquils, a goodly number of black tulips and a few red poppies. The jonquils represent Asian Americans; black tulips, Afro Americans; and red poppies, Native Americans. Some few white, slightly wilted, lilies will be permitted but not to exceed five per flag. These shall be located at random locations in the field. No geometrical designs are allowed. Specifically, no straight lines (vertical, angular or horizontal) of more than two lilies will be allowed. Also the placement of a white lily at each corner and one at the geometrical center of the field of flowers is forbidden. Some colored markings like 69, AC, or DC. are permitted. Initials like KKK or symbols such as the swastika are forbidden in any color or flower arrangement.

The entire flag is to be surrounded by a wide band of tan lace (pattern optional) to represent the Latin American population. The field of flowers shall be separated from the the stripes by a strip of condoms, syringes and/or bandAIDS. These may be used separately or intertwined. These symbols should be colored, not white. Commercial condoms and bandAIDS come in various colors and the liquid in the syringes can be tinted to match.

A national design contest will be held with Congress choosing the three best submissions. The people can then vote for their choice of one of these three by a call on a 900 number to the Larry King Live show. The revenues generated by the calls will be used for further medical research.

The White House, Supreme Court, each Cabinet Office, and each Embassy may design its own flag and will not be subject to the above mentioned restrictions or popular vote.

These individual flags may be changed or modified with each change of the Administration.
