BROWN BEAR "GRIZZLY"

(*Ursus arctos*)

This yearling cub stands bipedal, human-like, scratching the morning snow off his back. The cub's mother (sow) preceded him scratching her back and instructing the cub about scent trees within its territory on their way to a winter den site. Sows give birth to cubs in the winter den and stay with their cubs through three winters. This extended protection and teaching ensures the cubs' survival through sub-adult age, when they are weaned. Grizzlies are opportunistic omnivores that feed on seasonally abundant vegetation, ground squirrels, berries, carrion, and fish. Survival of the grizzly bear is closely related to the preservation of its habitat.

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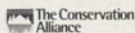
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
