**INDUSTRY GETS SNEAK PREVIEW OF C-SPAN SCHOOL BUS
DURING CABLE "HELL WEEK"**

--Bus on Display at Key Sites in Washington and New York--

Washington, D.C., September 14, 1993 -- Cable executives gathering in Washington DC and New York next week to kick off the fall season will get a sneak preview of the new C-SPAN School Bus.

Although the School Bus will not launch on its nationwide tour until November, it will be on display for cable operators and programmers attending the **Monday, Sept. 20 Women in Cable gala in Washington DC** and the **Wednesday, Sept. 22 Walter Kaitz Foundation dinner in New York**. The Bus will also be on display on **Wednesday, Sept. 22 from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm ET** outside the **Waldorf-Astoria Hotel** in New York.

The mission of C-SPAN's School Bus is to educate viewers about C-SPAN, America's original "Electronic Town Hall." The 45-foot bus is a customized interactive-learning facility equipped with computers and video monitors to provide students and teachers information about C-SPAN's programming and potential classroom use. In addition, it contains a three-camera programming studio that will gather a variety of local public affairs programming which will be cablecast on C-SPAN throughout the year.

C-SPAN is available in 59.6 million households nationwide and around the world via satellite. C-SPAN is entirely funded by America's cable television companies as a public service.

**NEW YORK GETS SNEAK PREVIEW OF C-SPAN SCHOOL BUS
-- Brand New Education and TV Vehicle Makes Debut in Manhattan --**

Washington, D.C., September 20, 1993 -- C-SPAN, the Washington-based Cable Satellite Public Affairs Network, will be debuting its new educational vehicle -- the C-SPAN School Bus -- in New York this week.

The cable industry, which funds C-SPAN, will get a sneak preview of the bright yellow motor coach when executives gather in New York this week for meetings at the Waldorf Astoria.

The C-SPAN School Bus, which launches its nationwide tour Nov. 1, will roll across the country this academic year to educate viewers about C-SPAN, America's original "Electronic Town Hall." The bus is a 45-foot customized educational center and television production facility on wheels. It is equipped with computers, video monitors and a three-camera programming studio. The technology is designed to give teachers and students an interactive media demonstration about C-SPAN as a way to learn more about the Democratic process and government.

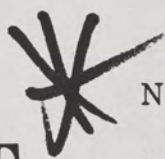

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BIOGRAPHY OF
CONGRESSMAN GEORGE MILLER

U.S. Representative George Miller, a leading spokesman on natural resources, children and families, has represented the 7th District of California since 1975.

He was elected Chairman of the Committee on Natural Resources (formerly Interior and Insular Affairs) in 1991. His Committee has jurisdiction over federal resource and environmental issues including water policy, oil, gas and mineral leasing (including offshore oil development), Alaska resources, nuclear power, national parks and public lands, Native Americans and U.S. territories.

Mr. Miller served from 1983-1991 as the first chairman of the Select Committee on Children, Youth and Families. He is also the 3rd ranking member of the Committee on Education and Labor.

George Miller's long list of legislative achievements includes California water reform, foster care and adoption reforms, child care, timber reform, the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) nutrition program, aid to victims of family violence, and children's mental health care. He led the congressional investigation into the March, 1989, Alaska oil spill and authored major portions of the 1990 oil spill liability law and sections of the Energy Policy Act of 1992.

Congressman Miller was born in Richmond, California, in 1945 and is an attorney. He is married to Cynthia Caccavo Miller, who is also a life-long resident of Contra Costa County. They have two sons, George and Stephen.
