In my area, suburban Philadelphia, our cable company, Herron Cable TV, only delivers C-Span and not C-Span 2.

Could you please advise me why this is and what needs be done for C-Span 2 to be received in this area? If your second channel is anything like your first, we here are certainly missing out on extremely useful programming.

In another vein, I want to congratulate you for the fine work that you and your staff are doing. Only by watching C-Span does one realize how spotty a job is done by the usual news outlets.

I wrote to the Philadelphia Inquirer to complain about their lack of coverage of budget news. Their written response in effect stated that it's all kind of overwhelming and confusing and, with a limited budget, they're doing what they can. And this is the fourth largest market in the U.S!

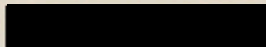
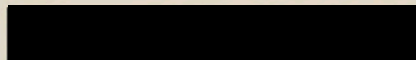
If Perot proved one thing (aside from his quirkiness), it's that a lot of people can cope with a lot more details than either government or the media (other than C-Span) wish to credit them for.

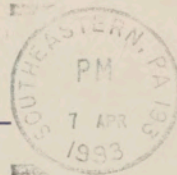
