Dear Brian -

I hope that you & Susan & Connie & Lew & all the staff will read this letter I wrote to President Clinton on September 28, 1998. I have been trying to get through to you - I even bought a new Sony phone with a fast re-dial - but usually all the "circuits" are busy. It is very important that the American people know that their President did not lie to them & he did not commit adultery. She urged him to - he would not & did not "go all the way."

The personal sex lives of people should not be looked into unless it is harassment & as Jennifer Flowers said on the Larry King show "Bill Clinton would never harass a woman. I loved him - I loved everything about him." Monica Lewinsky also said she loved the President & it was she who flirted with him & tempted him & he was aroused & gave in to an "improper relationship" - or "We were just fooling around according to Monica Lewinsky 'it wasn't sex.'" Dear President Clinton,
