James Meredith to stump for Duke

SHREVEPORT, La. (AP) — James Meredith, the black man who risked his life to integrate the University of Mississippi and now spurns integration as “a con job,” will campaign for governor’s candidate David Duke in Shreveport on Saturday.

“If he is elected it will be the best thing to happen to the black race in 50 years,” said Meredith, 59, from Jackson, Miss., on Wednesday.

Meredith will visit Shreveport to stump for Duke, a state representative from Metairie and a former Ku Klux Klan leader. Meredith will hold a press conference at the Caddo Parish Courthouse at 10 a.m.
