As part of its international public affairs coverage, C-SPAN will air speeches by Britain's Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher, Neil Kinnock, leader of the Britain's opposition Labour Party, and by King Hussein of Jordan.

On Friday, October 13, if the U.S. House of Representatives is not in session, C-SPAN will air live from Blackspool, England, a speech by Mrs. Thatcher before the Conservative Party conference. The speech will air at approximately 9:30am ET/ 6:30am PT, followed by a taped address by opposition party leader Neil Kinnock before the Labour Party conference.
