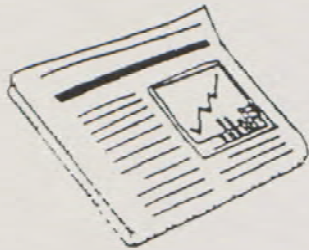

C-SPAN'S SPECIAL MEMORIAL DAY PROGRAMMING "VIETNAM REVISITED" ELICITS STRONG NATIONAL RESPONSE

--More than 3,000 Viewer Calls Registered on Special Comment Line--

Washington, D.C., June 3, 1992--C-SPAN's Viewer Services Department received more than 3,000 viewer calls during Memorial Day weekend, following the network's thirty-hour special "Vietnam Revisited." The calls came in on a special "viewer comment line" during the four-day weekend, the first time the network has utilized this feature.

"We decided to use the 'viewer comment line' for this program because it aired over a holiday weekend when our regular staff was unavailable," said Kathy Murphy, Director of Viewer Services. "The volume of response in four days, which exceeded our regular monthly average, was surprising."

C-SPAN has averaged 2,880 viewer phone calls a month over the first half of this year through its regular viewer services system. The special phone line for "Vietnam Revisited" asked callers whether they generally liked or disliked the video-verite journey with the Senate mission on POW/MIA issues, and then prompted a verbal response.

Almost two thirds of the callers, or a total of approximately 1,840, liked the programming. "Watching the plane touch down in Hanoi, I felt the same chills that I felt the day I arrived in that country. I want to thank you for helping to bring this part of my life to a close," said one viewer.

Other viewers, a total of 255, disliked the program: "I think that it is disgusting that on Memorial Day you have to take your time to bring us back to Vietnam. You did more damage to my husband than you can believe," said another viewer.

A total of 951 callers could not leave a comment because of rotary phones.

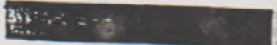

C-SPAN RE-AIRS SPECIAL "VIETNAM REVISITED" A VIDEO JOURNEY TO VIETNAM TODAY

--C-SPAN Follows Senate POW/MIA Committee Delegation to Vietnam--

Washington, D.C., July 20, 1992--Seventeen years after the fall of Saigon, C-SPAN, the Cable Satellite Public Affairs Network, spent a week in Vietnam with the Senate Select Committee on POW/MIA Affairs. "**Vietnam Revisited: A Video Journey from Hanoi to the Mekong Delta**" is the result, of unprecedented, original programming which re-airs **August 31 to September 4, beginning at 12 PM (ET) each day.**

The Senate Select Committee on POW/MIA Affairs was established to investigate POW/MIA issues and how they have been handled by the U.S. Government, Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia. On April 16, a delegation left on a week-long fact-finding mission to Southeast Asia, including one area in Vietnam where alleged sightings of American prisoners of war have taken place. C-SPAN cameras closely followed the senators, turning viewers into silent members of the delegation.

The program includes footage of areas in Vietnam not seen by Americans since 1975. A generation of Americans with personal experiences of the war will relate to long-form scenes of Ho Chi Minh City and Hanoi, as well as villages and battlefields. C-SPAN's signature video verite style also transports viewers into the Ho Chi Minh mausoleum, onto the bustling streets of Hanoi, and through the heat of the backwater villages where the war was fought.

The programming includes:

- An historical overview of Vietnamese society and politics, followed by a walking tour of the War Museum and the Ho Chi Minh Memorial, and interviews with Ngo Ba Thanh, a member of the Vietnam National Assembly and Nguyen Xuan Oahn, an investment and management consultant.

--C-SPAN Follows Senate POW/MIA Committee Delegation to Vietnam--

Washington, D.C., August 28, 1992--Seventeen years after the fall of Saigon, C-SPAN, the Cable Satellite Public Affairs Network, spent a week in Vietnam with the Senate Select Committee on POW/MIA Affairs. "**Vietnam Revisited: A Video Journey from Hanoi to the Mekong Delta**" is the result, of unprecedented, original programming which re-airs **August 31 to September 4, from 12:00-6:00 PM (ET) Monday through Thursday and 12:00-5:00 PM (ET) on Friday**. The program will include live Viewer Call-Ins, open phones and other question/answer segments.

The Senate Select Committee on POW/MIA Affairs was established to investigate POW/MIA issues and how they have been handled by the U.S. Government, Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia. On April 16, a delegation left on a week-long fact-finding mission to Southeast Asia, including one area in Vietnam where alleged sightings of American prisoners of war have taken place. C-SPAN cameras closely followed the senators, turning viewers into silent members of the delegation.

The program includes footage of areas in Vietnam not seen by Americans since 1975. A generation of Americans with personal experiences of the war will relate to long-form scenes of Ho Chi Minh City and Hanoi, as well as villages and battlefields. C-SPAN's signature video verite style also transports viewers into the Ho Chi Minh mausoleum and onto the bustling streets of Hanoi.

The programming includes:

- * "**Life In Vietnam**" - scenes of Saigon and a discussion with Katie Kelly, author of "A Year In Saigon -- How I gave up my glitzy job in television to have the time of my life teaching Amerasian kids in Saigon".
- * "**POW Story**" - a look at POW's which includes interviews with Sen. John McCain (R-AZ), Sen. Charles Grassley (R-IA), Sen. John Kerry (D-MA) and other Senate POW Committee members.

- * *"War Aftermath"* - a discussion on "agent orange" with Reed Irvine of Accuracy In The Media. Also in this segment is, Fred Downs, Vietnam veteran, author of *No Longer Enemies, Not Yet Friends*, and current director of the Prosthetic and Sensory Aids Service at the Veterans Administration.
- * *"Economics and Future Relations"* - a roundtable discussion on the current economic state of Vietnam and what future relations will bring. Guests: TBA

The delegation of the Senate Select Committee on POW/MIA Affairs that C-SPAN followed from Hanoi to the Mekong Delta consisted of Chairman John F. Kerry (D-MA), Vice-Chairman Bob Smith (R-NH), Sens. Charles S. Robb (D-VA), Hank Brown (R-CO), and Charles Grassley (R-IA), and members of their staff.
