-- C-SPAN TELEVISES "ALL ROADS LEAD TO PHILADELPHIA" MAY 24 & 25 --- George Bush, Warren Burger Address Constitutional Convention Commemoration --

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- <u>C-SPAN</u> cable network plans televised coverage of <u>"All</u> Roads Lead to Philadelphia" -- the <u>May 24 and 25</u> opening activities for the celebration of the Bicentennial of the Constitution.

The thirteen governors currently serving as chief executives of the original states have been invited to Philadelphia for a weekend of events to commemorate the convening of the Constitutional Convention on May 25, 1787. C-SPAN's program line-up from Philadelphia includes <u>live</u> telecasts of state delegation and governors' meetings, live viewer call-in programs with governors, historians, and journalists, and coverage of the official ceremonies marking the start of the Constitutional Convention.

On <u>Sunday</u>, <u>May 24th at 12:30 pm ET</u>, C-SPAN begins its two-day cablecast with a live viewer call-in program, featuring host <u>Governor Robert Casey (D-PA)</u>. At 1:00 pm ET, Christopher Collier, author of <u>Decision at Philadelphia</u>, and Independence National Park historian David Kimball discuss the significance of Philadelphia as the site for the Constitutional Convention and the weekend commemorative events.

At 2:00 pm ET, delegations from the 13 original states meet to explore issues facing their governments during a session called "Visions of the States: The People." C-SPAN opens up its phone lines for viewer comments during a break at 3:15 pm ET. "Visions of the States: Past, Present, and Future" is the title of a gathering of governors from the 13 original states, beginning at 3:30 pm ET. This session originates live from Long Gallery in Independence Hall -- where the signing of both the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution took place. Two governors will take viewer questions and comments during a live call-in show at 5:00 pm ET.

C-SPAN's telecast continues on Monday, May 25 at 8:00 am ET with a call-in program featuring two governors. Philadelphia reporters Jonathan Storm of the Inquirer and Scott Flander of the Daily News examine media coverage of the commemorative activities surrounding the Bicentennial of the Constitution, at 9:00 am.

The more than eight hours of C-SPAN programming from Philadelphia concludes with <u>live</u> coverage of remarks by <u>Vice President George Bush</u> and chairman of the U.S. Commission on the Bicentennial of the Constitution, former <u>Chief</u>

Justice Warren Burger, airing at 2:00 pm ET.
