Your audience may be interested to know that Global Volunteers has been sending teams of volunteers to two sites in China since April 1996. Volunteers teach conversational English to Chinese students, elementary to adult, in the communities of Xi'an (the starting point of the silk road) and Baoji. Both communities are located southwest of Beijing. The Sino-American Society in Xi'an and their president An Wei, have invited Global Volunteers to help local people provide the best education possible for their children and to create a solid foundation for mutual understanding between North Americans and the Chinese People. Service programs last between two and three weeks.

According to a recent volunteer, Kathy Skinner, from Nevada, Iowa, the "teachers" often learn more than their students. "I learned that the Chinese are very industrious and their quest for education is evident in everything from exams to TV sitcoms and billboards," she explained.

Volunteers pay a tax-deductible service program fee of \$1,995 that covers food, lodging, an experienced on-site team leader, project materials and travel within the communities. During free-time, volunteers can choose to visit many cultural and historical sites in the region, including one of the world's greatest archaeological treasures, the Army of Terra-Cotta Warriers.

Global Volunteers is an international private, nonprofit, nonsectarian development organization based in St. Paul, Minn. Each year Global Volunteers coordinates more than 125 teams of volunteers who work on development projects in 17 countries. Projects range from construction and health care assistance to the teaching of English and free-enterprise principles. No special experience is required.

Global Volunteers is a nonprofit, nonsectarian international development organization based in St. Paul, Minnesota. Founded in 1984 by Global Volunteers strives to wage peace throughout the world by helping to establish mutual understanding between people of diverse cultures.

Each year Global Volunteers coordinates more than 125 teams of North Americans who participate on short-tenn human and economic development projects. From all backgrounds, and of all ages, our volunteers become "servant-learners," working with and learning from people in 17 countries.
