These outstanding newsmakers respond candidly to queries by members of the press and professional peers in other countries. Reporters from such respected news organizations as Britain's BBC, Germany's ARD, Japan's NHK and Brazil's TV Globo regularly attend "Dialogues," citing WORLDNET as their primary news source on important issues. Since its inception, WORLDNET has conducted "Dialogues" in every inhabited continent—reaching millions of people in a single day—with a cumulative total of more than 700 live telecasts.

Now in its fourth successful year, "America Today" brings timely, balanced, comprehensive news coverage of the United States to a worldwide audience. The hour-long program, with its lively news magazine format, also details the latest American trends in finance, personal health, science and entertainment, with weekly round-up reports on American government, sports and public opinion. The program features seven-minute headline news segments on the hour and half-hour.

A fast-paced 60 minutes of information and entertainment each weekday, "Hour USA" is one of WORLDNET's newest series. It is a unique blend of 15-, 30- and 60-minute program segments on American music, sports, travel, wildlife, economics, and science, plus twice-weekly English language telecourses. "Hour USA" programs include "Jazz from the Smithsonian," "George Michael's Sports Machine," "Wild America," "Adam Smith's Money World," "Science World," "American English I," "Profiles in American Art" and many more. On special occasions, "American Classic Feature Films," which include such illustrious titles as "A Star Is" Born," "It's a Wonderful Life" and "His Girl Friday," are scheduled.
