Dear Mr. Lamb,

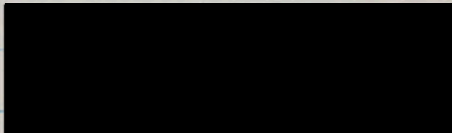
I thought you might be interested in the excuse my cable company used when they are replacing C-Span II with other programming. Are there "New rules" made in the Senate in connection with C-Span II?
