

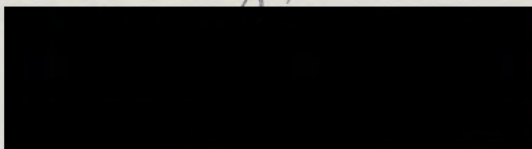

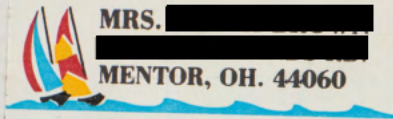
Dear Senator Hatch,
