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Dear Mr. Evans:

To me (whose background entails two degrees in "mass-comm," plus work experience in media, and an abiding interest in our most grave national crisis since the Civil War---that of monopoly press failure), you are the kind of reporter who just might be able to restore a modicum of trust and respect with this insular, arrogant, insuperable, oligopolic---for starters---major-media, linear and electronic. I will not, however, hold my aging breath; for, ^{VIA} some 30 years of watching buffoons like This Simon Character appearing opposite you this day (and he is far from the worst, for sure), I am literally underwriting Kevin P. Phillips' dictum that the First Amendment is not operational for most of us out here, and, is surely not up to dealing with any kind of corrective to this grotesquerie. He says with a touch of humility and assured finality (my second thesis was to have concerned itself with netnews crimes that would have jailed ordinary people; and, should have ended with termination of operations all places for the troika, especially the archvillain, CBS News).

We are at a flashpoint wherein I for one believe almost no thing I get from a member of Paul Johnson's ^{NAMED} (and, boy! are they no Paul Johnsons!) "seven deadly sinners" (plus some more). All they have to sell is credibility; and, they are bankrupt. It is cultural, of course. The chasm widens, deepens and darkens. Once all faith is lost, they will deny that legacy as well.

C-SPAN is a good example, looking good by comparison, mainly. This tokenism allows a soupcon of access and accountability; yet, is still doctrinaire leftism. More later on that.

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No one is more cloistered and full with hubris than these few who sit atop the buttons and levers of supranational (U.S. Justice anti-trust is moribund; and, we would just get more of same if the things were burst) control of information. Prof. Jerome A. Barron's statutory access law is needed; nevertheless, one wrong turn in the radio robber baronny days now ensure our knowledge demise, by and large. Indeed, as many say, TV is the worst development ever to overtake pressdom; surely in its current structuring. These Borgias and Dorians Gray at the speed of light will not even address the indictment.

C-SPAN will schedule the Noam Chomskys, L. Fulanis, L. Farrakhans---all to the good, as a part of an ever-widening dialog---endlessly. But, this "best of the shabby lot," without commercials and pretending to be utterly neutral, has never seen fit to give equal hearings to, say, the nation's oldest and largest sports-persons' faction, NRA. C-SPAN's choices for shows are overwhelmingly doctrinaire left-liberals; as are the "Booknotes" guests (one especially nauseating segment featured B.
