I wanted to write and complement you on the program 1968-The Campaign, Vietnam, Culture and the Cronkite interview. I enjoyed the program and the quality of the discourse. I thought the film footage was interesting, you could have shown more, but it was a great balance between interviews and talk.

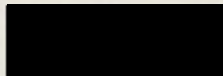
I would be interested in seeing a program on Watergate and one on the individual Presidents and their various biographers in a round table discussion supplemented with film footage.
