-- C-SPAN CAMERAS TRAVEL TO CHICAGO --

-- Cable Network Focuses on Illinois Politics / Republican Mainstream Convention --

WASHINGTON, D.C.-- C-SPAN cable network's "Campaign '86" election series hits the campaign trail this month with a trip to Chicago for a closer look at Illinois politics.

Chicago has been targeted as the first stop on C-SPAN's 16-state "Campaign '86" tour for coverage of the hottly contested statewide elections. Also, the first annual meeting of the Republican Mainstream Committee (RMC) coincides with C-SPAN's visit and RMC convention workshops and speeches are included in the cable network's Chicago programming line-up.

On April 24th at 9:30 pm EST, C-SPAN begins its four-day "Campaign '86" coverage, including more than 20 hours of <u>live</u> viewer call-ins, roundtable discussions, and RMC convention sessions originating from Chicago.

Call-in programs are an important ingredient in C-SPAN's election programming. C-SPAN's nationwide audience can participate in the process by phoning-in questions and comments for featured guests, including candidates for statewide office, state political party leaders, and local political scholars and journalists. C-SPAN viewers can also catch glimpses of the Windy City through "video vignettes" interspersed between programs.
