I would like to take this time to thank you for your support of this educational program in Washington, D.C. You helped make it possible for eight [redacted] students to have a personal visit with Representative Pat Roberts, and with Senator Kassebaum and Senator Dole. Senator Dole allowed each student to call home from his Minority leader office in the Capitol. The student week had activities centered around our foreign policy with Africa. They visited African embassies and had several seminars and a legislative simulation activity which focused on the African topic. Their Program Instructors gave them additional information on the significance of each monument. They visited the Viet Nam Memorial, went to the top of the Washington Monument, saw the changing of guard ceremony at the Tomb of Unknown soldier at Arlington, stopped at the Lincoln and Jefferson Memorial, viewed the Magna Carta and Constitution at the National Archives, saw Ford's Theater, had the VIP tour of the White House, and the FBI building. They also viewed the memorials to Robert and John Kennedy and Lee's Mansion at Arlington. They attended a dinner theater with the viewing of the production "The King and I". Additional time was spent in the Smithsonian Museums of American History, Natural History, Air and Space, and Art.
