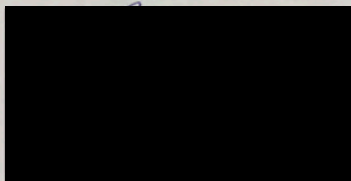
Dear Mr. Byrd:
