Dear Mr. Lamb:

We sent a letter to your office, dated, 8 September 1992, about the Senate Select Committee on POW-MIA's and related matters.

As you are now aware, Mr. Serban Oprica, was one witness, under oath, on Tuesday, November 10th, and Mr. Steve Kiba and Mr. Robert Dumas, were witnesses, under oath, on Wednesday, November 11, 1992.

Now, you must be aware, that the Court Case sent to you is real and we are inclosing two (2) letters about what happened to Mr. Dumas after his returned home. (see letters of November 16 and 17, 1992).

As no doubt one of the Government agencies have now seen our files we are going to amend the Federal Case and file all the documents we have in this matter. They will cause alot of heads to roll in the different agencies!

The Defendants will increase from eight (8) in number to about seventeen (16) that will include a General, another Senator, and several civilians working in very high positions in different agencies.

We will send you a copy of the Amended Complaint and if you would like, we could appear on one of your programs.

Dear Sir:

This is to advise you that there was a break-in at my home on Saturday, November 14, 1992, at which time all the documents, pictures, and recordings, that are to be used in the above titled case were taken.

It was reported to the State of Connecticut Police and a telephone call was also made by the undersigned to the Field Office of the F.B.I. in New Haven, Connecticut. The answer by the F.B.I. to me was "we know all about you and nothing will be done by this office" and they hung up.

The person and/or persons did not take any TV's, radios, or other personal items of great value, but they did take a tape recorder with Ambassador Ho Jung's last statements taken about November 5th, 1992, who is the United Nations Observer from the North Korean Government, plus the contents of one file case and the contents of my personal briefcase.

It seems very strange that the Government Attorney, Mr. John B. Hughes, from the New Haven office, assigned to the case, told me that he was going to request "discovery" of documents in the case but he never made a request to the Court and that was some two-three weeks ago. However, by this letter, we are not charging said Attorney with having anything to do with the unlawful removal of said documents, so forth. But would you not agree, it was some of the documents that the Government wanted?

Because of said unlawful removal of said documents, we are going to amend the named case with other copies that we had in other places because we had expected what happened, did in fact happen!

This is a Federal Case with documents, pictures, so forth, that have crossed several State lines plus from several foreign countries and we believe that one of your agencies should investigate the unlawful removal.

Further, a request to have a meeting with the Judge and your Attorney assigned to the Case will be requested.

A request is hereby made to your office to answer this letter in writing.

MOTION FOR INFORMAL HEARING

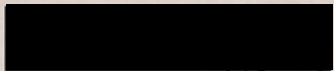

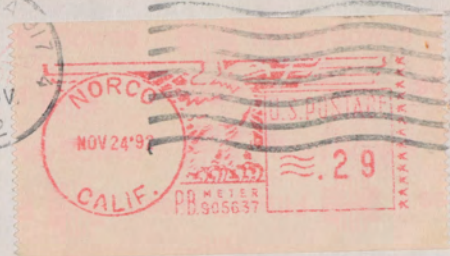
