The Evening News program from Moscow is an important and highly informative service of C-SPAN (2). The translators are excellent too.

C-SPAN however creates a distraction by having the English words "Evening News Moscow" constantly on the screen, blocking printed names and titles in the Russian languages.

Those of us who are familiar with the Russian languages would like to be able to read the Russian sub-titles, even though we can not hear the original Russian spoken. However the C-SPAN super-imposed sub-title "Evening News Moscow" makes that impossible, especially in view of the short time span of the Russian sub-titles.

Would it be possible to indicate that the program originates from Moscow with a smaller C-SPAN sub-title placed in a corner (upper left or upper right)? I'm certain that C-SPAN can make this adjustment without undue difficulty.

Thank you for your efforts in this regard and thank you for the Moscow Evening News broadcasts.
