Article I, Section III, clause 7 gives the judgment of all impeachments; judgment in cases of impeachment shall not extend FURTHER than to removal from office, and disqualification to hold and enjoy any office of honor, trust or profit under the United States: but the party convicted shall nevertheless be liable and subject to indictment, trial, judgement and punishment, according to law.

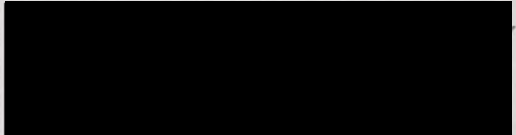

The answer to the first one is Yes. And since the House of Representatives impeached him, he must go on trial. Then if he is convicted he must be ousted from office immediately.

My history book by David Saville Muzzey PHD, Barnard College, and Columbia Univ. copyright 1911, 1917, 1920 says that the censure of Andrew Jackson was illegal. After three years Senator Thomas H. Benton succeeded in getting it expunged from the journal.
