"BLACK" VS. "AFRICAN AMERICAN" DEBATE ON C-SPAN

C-SPAN will air a debate sponsored by Wire magazine entitled "Staying Black or Becoming African American" on **Saturday, October 7, at 12 noon ET/9:00am PT.**
