The first was Rev. Thomas Skinner  
who talked about blacks taking  
responsibility for their own actions &  
not depending on the government or

He said, & rightly so, that they were suffering

from a violence of the spirit.

The other gentleman was John Wolfe Pres. of Savannah University who told them that If they took all the money they spent going to dinners & banquets & talking about their problems, they would have a vast amount to contribute to the solutions.
